The new Associate Dean will have direct oversight for administrative management for the graduate nursing degree program. In addition, the successful candidate will be responsible for other selected areas of the School of Health Sciences and Nursing as designated by the Dean. The College of Nursing enrolls about 700 undergraduate students and nearly 150 graduate students at the main campus in Beckley, and the two branch campuses in Martinsburg, West Virginia and Orlando, Florida. The new Associate Dean will report directly to the Dean of the School of Health Sciences, coordinate the nursing programs on the new branch campuses, teach one course per semester, and participate on the School of Health Sciences and Nursing Leadership Team.

The University enrolls nearly 8,000 students in its traditional and non-traditional programs, with more than five campuses offering classroom based academic studies, distance education, and online learning.
