Mount Aloysius College, a dynamic, growing Catholic college founded and sponsored by the Religious Sisters of Mercy, seeks an energetic, experienced, and motivated development professional to become its new **Vice President for Institutional Advancement**. Reporting to and working closely with the President, and serving as a member of the President's Executive Council, the Vice President will provide leadership for the College's fundraising, marketing, and public relations programs. The institutional advancement staff of eight includes alumni relations and annual giving; major and planned gift development; corporate, foundation, and government grant support; and marketing and public relations. The school's fundraising success has been demonstrated most recently by topping its campaign goal nearly a year ahead of schedule.

Established in 1853, Mount Aloysius is a private, accredited, Catholic college welcoming women and men of all creeds, races, nationalities, and ages. A comprehensive liberal arts and science based institution with a commitment to career directed study, Mount Aloysius enrolls 1,200 full-time undergraduates and 400 part-time undergraduate and graduate students in more than 50 academic programs in Health Sciences and Nursing, Humanities, Education, Social Sciences, Natural and Applied Sciences, Business Administration, and Pre-Professional Study. Its 165-acre mountaintop campus includes both historic and new buildings for classrooms, laboratories, residence halls, athletics and fitness, and student life, where the College fulfills its mission to respond to individual and community needs with quality educational programs. Mount Aloysius student athletes participate in the NCAA's Division III.

Qualifications: Requirements include a bachelor's or higher degree; experience in annual and major gift programs, preferably in higher education; and familiarity and knowledge in planned giving, corporate and foundation relations, and marketing. The successful candidate must be skilled in organizing, planning, and executing effective initiatives across the spectrum of institutional advancement. Supervisory and management skills, both strategic and operational, that encourage a productive and effective institutional advancement division, as well as excellent interpersonal communication and team building skills are needed. Candidates should value the tradition of the Sisters of Mercy and their commitment to a just and caring environment where hospitality and compassionate service flourish.

Environment: Located in the heart of the Laurel Highlands of West Central Pennsylvania, an area famous for outdoor sports, Cresson offers easy access to Pittsburgh, 75 miles away; Altoona, a 20-minute commute; and Washington, D.C., only three hours away.
