



Assistant/Associate Professor of Accounting

As part of its process of redefining teaching for the 21st Century, Florida-based Saint Leo University seeks a flexible and energetic full-time **Assistant/Associate Professor of Accounting** for its multiple **Virginia Peninsula Education Centers**. Tenure or non-tenure track, based on the qualifications of the select candidate, this 12-month, regional faculty position offers a variety of opportunities to serve traditional and nontraditional learners in four diverse locations, including on two military bases as well as online, at both undergraduate and graduate levels.

The University's Department of Accounting, Economics, and Finance, housed within the Donald R. Tapia School of Business, is seeking a passionate and dedicated professional to teach nine courses per year and to provide appropriate student support and advisement. The centers operate on six eight-week terms, annually. Faculty members are expected to teach five of the six terms, with many courses being offered in the evenings and weekends. The new Assistant/Associate Professor of Accounting will possess a history of successful physical and virtual classroom teaching, an understanding of and skill in the use of technology-based, discipline-specific curriculum delivery, and broad experience with traditional-age and adult learners. Continued professional development, service to the University in the form of committee work, as well as undertaking community service in keeping with the University's Benedictine values will be important. The successful candidate must possess a Doctorate in Accounting, or closely related field, from a regionally accredited institution with credentials to teach Accounting courses at the undergraduate and graduate level, including a minimum 18 graduate semester credits in Accounting. Military requirements mandate that the final candidate must be a United States citizen in order to be granted access to military bases where classes will be conducted.

The University has seen record enrollments in recent years, with more than 16,000 students at the traditional main University Campus in Florida, through the Center for Online Learning, and at 23 education centers in seven states.
