



Dean for the School of Health Sciences and Education

Truman State University—Missouri’s highly selective public liberal arts and sciences university—seeks a strategic and innovative administrative professional as its next Dean for the School of Health Sciences and Education. The University looks for a leader who can combine a sense of humor and a positive attitude with a high level of communication and collaboration.

The Institution: A vibrant community of teacher-scholars working closely with an academically-talented student body, Truman is a residential university providing its approximately 6,000 students with broad liberal arts experiences and in-depth study in 49 undergraduate majors and nine graduate programs. Truman is nationally recognized for the quality of educational opportunities that it offers and for its leadership in the assessment of student learning. The University is a proud member of the Council of Public Liberal Arts Colleges (COPLAC)—an organization of publicly funded colleges with a strong dedication to the liberal arts—and is focused on sustaining high-quality relationships between students and faculty, selective admissions, recognition of cultural and intellectual diversity, and a commitment to high-quality liberal arts education for those who may not achieve it otherwise. The Position: The Dean for the School of Health Sciences and Education provides leadership for the School and works with department chairs, faculty, and staff to achieve the goals of the School and the University. The Dean is committed to helping students achieve essential learning outcomes in all aspects of their education at the University and, in particular, is committed to the value that a liberal arts and sciences education contributes to student development. The Dean must be an individual with a high standard of personal and professional ethics and integrity who will work collaboratively with department chairs and faculty to articulate a vision for the School that is consistent with the mission of Truman State University, including goals for inclusivity and diversity. The Dean will supervise and evaluate the performance of department chairs and faculty within the School. The Dean will promote teamwork and continuous improvement among students, faculty, and staff as well as provide intellectual leadership for the School. The Dean will promote assessment as a means of measuring progress toward School and University goals as well as develop strategies to secure external resources to support both School and University programs. The Dean is committed to faculty and staff development and adopts strategies to support faculty teaching, scholarship, and service consistent with the Teacher-Scholar model. The Dean

reports to the Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs, serves on Truman's Deans' Council, and performs other duties as assigned by the Vice President and President of the University.

About the School: The School of Health Sciences and Education is committed to preparing students to effectively serve as professionals and leaders in their communities and fields by providing an exceptional education grounded in the liberal arts and sciences, fostering interdisciplinary collaboration, promoting diverse learning experiences, and inspiring the pursuit of continued scholarship and research. The School consists of approximately 75 faculty members in four academic departments, including Communication Disorders, Education (Elementary, Secondary, Special Education, and Counseling), Health and Exercise Sciences (including Athletic Training), and Nursing. In addition to undergraduate programming, the School offers Masters programs in Education, Communication Disorders, and Athletic Training and is developing an online Masters in Mental Health and School Counseling that will be housed in the school. The school and its programs maintain state-of-the-art laboratories. Many opportunities exist for interprofessional education within the school as well as through community partnerships. The School supports a variety of outreach programs including the Regional Professional Development Center (a state-funded program providing services to the K-12 schools in Northeast Missouri), off-campus classes in the St. Louis metropolitan area, an outpatient Speech and Hearing Clinic, and others.

Qualifications: The successful candidate will have significant academic and/or administrative experience, be committed to the liberal arts and sciences and public higher education, and have the capacity to develop and lead a strategic vision for the School. S/he should demonstrate an ability to provide management, organizational efficiency, and program administration through experiences including external accreditation processes. Success securing external grants, especially for programs involving multiple constituencies or academic units, and experience working with external university constituencies including alumni, donors, and private foundations will be important. The Dean will have a strong sense of financial accountability and manage resources with discretion and efficiency. The ability to write and speak clearly and effectively, the ability to build relationships and rapport with a wide range of individuals, and a record of promoting diversity are crucial. S/he must hold a terminal degree in one of the disciplines of the School or a related field and possess a record of successful teaching, scholarship, and service sufficient for eligibility for tenure at the full professor level.

Location: Located in Kirksville, Missouri, Truman plays a vital role in the thriving regional center of northeast Missouri. The city enjoys a low crime rate, excellent schools, and low cost of living. Within a few minutes' drive, a broad range of outdoor recreational opportunities is easily accessible. Kirksville is connected to St. Louis (STL) by Cape Air (www.capeair.com). Amtrak operates the Southwest Chief on daily schedules from La Plata (13 miles from Kirksville) to Chicago, Kansas City, and points southwest to Los Angeles. A. T.
