## Dean, Faculty of Psychology

Established in 1994 by the Pelita Harapan Foundation, **Universitas Pelita Harapan (UPH)** is a university committed to the noble cause of Christ-centered higher education. UPH enrolls approximately 8,500 students (including more than 600 postgraduate students) in 29 undergraduate and six graduate programs, a law school, and a medical school. The faculty are internationally diverse. The University has multiple campus sites, with the main campus situated on more than 34 acres of land just 12 miles from the capital city of Jakarta. Indonesia, the fourth most populous country in the world, is ethnically and culturally diverse. The country is a democracy and is considered very westernized. The University is currently seeking an experienced administrator to become the new **Dean of the Faculty of Psychology**. Reporting to the Provost, the successful candidate will be responsible for managing a bachelor's degree program that enrolls more than 220 full-time students and supports eight full-time lecturers. The school offers three major concentrations, including Educational Psychology, Clinical Psychology/Counseling, and Industrial and Organizational Psychology. UPH offers the first Christian psychology program in Indonesia and all Christian students in this major field of study must minor in Christian World View, which consists of 20 credit hours. With a successful accreditation, the school is eligible to add graduate programs. There is a desire to add a master's degree in Clinical Counseling, as well as to launch a counseling center for students that would provide clinical practicum opportunities for the graduate students.

The new Dean will be responsible for overseeing the accreditation of the Psychology school through the Indonesia Higher Education Authority, as well as supporting the University's co-curricular general education program. Broad experience in undergraduate psychology programs and sufficient familiarity with graduate psychology programs is required. Previous administrative experience is essential, and international experience or a high level of cultural sensitivity is preferred. The new Dean will be responsible for teaching four semester hours. A proven ability to integrate faith and learning in the academic curriculum is required. An earned doctorate in Psychology or a closely related field is mandatory. The successful candidate must fully understand and support the University's mission and vision as an evangelical Christian institution.
